### **Introduction to the Workshop**

On the occasion of the International Human Rights Day, the German Embassy in Morocco has the pleasure to host the *Media Freedom Coalition Embassy Network Meeting* in Rabat on 10 December 2024. This workshop aims at fostering dialogue and facilitating collaboration among embassy members of the Media Freedom Coalition (MFC) in Morocco, as well as to raise awareness to the Coalition's goals, objectives, and instruments.

The workshop will explore opportunities for joint actions, such as collaborative initiatives, awareness campaigns, and capacity-building programs to strengthen press freedom and media development. Through these discussions, the network meeting seeks to align local efforts with the global goals of the Media Freedom Coalition.

#### What is the MFC?

The Media Freedom Coalition is a cross-regional partnership of countries working together to advocate for media freedom, both online and offline. The MFC advocates for the safety of journalists and media workers, and holds to account those who harm journalists and severely restrict them from doing their job.

The MFC was established in July 2019 at the Global Conference for Media Freedom and now comprises 50 member states from six continents.
